

# Grand Prix Bordino

Italians are well known for great operas (and other cultural high lights!) and they understand how to translate the key elements emotions and sound into today's classic car scenery.

Between 1924 and 1930 the "Circuito Bordino" was a well-known race in Italy. In time it was as important as Mille Miglia, Giro di Sicilia, Targa Florio, Coppa di Messina, G.P. di Monza or Circuito del Mugello. The most famous drivers in period raced GP Bordino for instance: Tazio Nuvolari, Achille Varzi, Louis Chiron, Enzo Ferrari, Luigi Fagioli...

Times have changed but still great cars and fabulous landscape are still the same. Top hospitality, the best wine and cooking reci-

pes, these are the ingredients of the modern Grand Prix Bordino on stage 7-9 June 2019 in Piedmont Italy.

The 2019 edition will visit the "Langhe" and neighboring territories, belonging to the UNESCO World Heritage. Sixty cars of exceptional historical and collectible interest, protagonists of the history of motoring from 1925 to 1968, will give life to the 29th revival of the Grand Prix Bordino. Some cars have taken part in the most important events of the time: Mille Miglia, Targa Florio, 24 Hours of Le Mans or Goodwood.

On Friday, the first day of the event, many aficionados welcome the participants in Alessandria, which by then will be turned





into a city “of the past”, with lots animations and visitors dressed in period costumes.

Villages such as Alba, Barolo, Monforte, Dogliani, Grinzane Cavour, will be lined up along the picturesque route on Saturday. The cars, with rigorously dressed vintage crews will be welcomed enthusiastically. Along the winding roads and through old villages nestled on beautiful hills, illuminated by the sun in a mosaic of colors, the route will get the crews back to Alessandria to enjoy excellent cuisine, world-class wines and impeccable hospitality which can only be granted by friends:

streets for the GP Bordino Revival. The city center will be transformed into a true place of past competitive racing. Thousands of people will watch the



Grand Prix on the grandstand cheering for their drivers. Taking part to such an event, you become an integral part of people who truly enjoy classic cars and friendship. All the crew members are dressed in the period style, matching the cars period. Tweed and leather jackets, blazers, flat caps and classic driver's suit are always highly welcome. This is little Goodwood in Italy!
